They have two courses available to hire, one on a rubber surface and the other, with a larger number of jumps, on grass (with good ground cover and old turf). Both have a variety of interesting, spooky coloured fillers and on a recent trip the grass course included two water trays of different shapes, wavy planks, and a narrow gate. This was all very good practice as I haven't been doing a great deal of jumping over the summer. To date the Cooksons charge £10 an hour per horse and they live at Manor Farm, Upper Slaughter, Glos.
